TECHNICAL SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA

The following are the scholarship criteria. Each applicant MUST be:

1. High School seniors are eligible to apply. Applicant must be enrolled in a two-year technical or trade school program, in good standing, at the time of selection;
2. Both a U.S. citizen and a legal resident of one of the following states – Arizona, Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, South Dakota, Texas, Utah, or Wyoming;
3. Studying an applicable trade; and,
4. Have an expressed interest in mining as a career path.

Scholarship selection is managed as follows:

1. The Rocky Mountain Mining Institute will distribute scholarship applications to interested academic institutions; applications are also available on our website (www.RockyMtnMining.org). Applications will be accepted only from students meeting the scholarship criteria.
2. Applications will be reviewed and rated by the Scholarship Committee. Interview of top candidates may be conducted.

Scholarship presentation is handled as follows:

1. The monetary value of the scholarship is sent directly to the college or university to be used as tuition credit for the winner. This money will not be sent directly to the recipient due to Federal mandates. The scholarship is valued at \$1000.

Application deadline is March 1, 2022. No applications will be accepted after that date. Interviews of prospective candidates will be conducted in March. Scholarship winners will be selected and notified in April.
