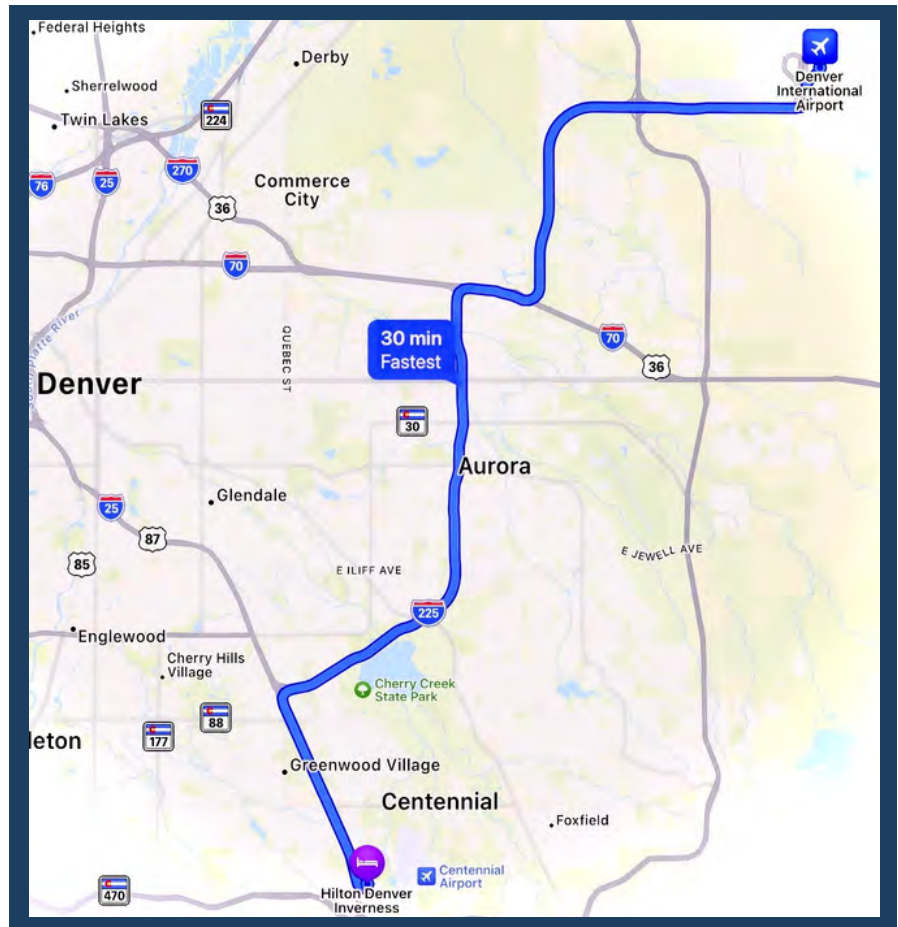
By Air

Denver International Airport (DEN): Hilton Denver Inverness is conveniently located 30 miles away from the Denver International Airport

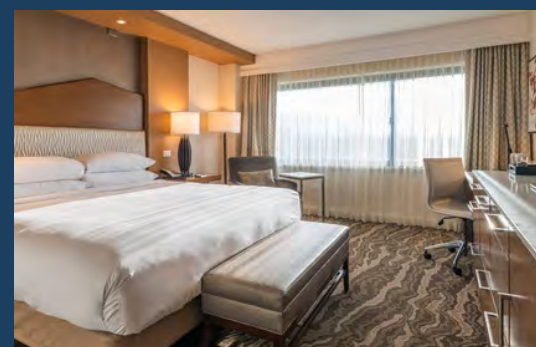
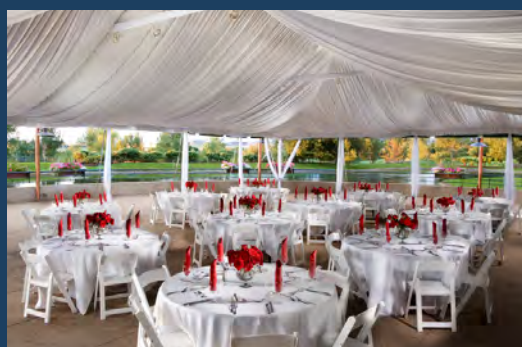
