### **Travel**

### By Air

**Aspen/Pitkin County Airport (ASE):** The Viewline Resort is situated in the town of Snowmass Village roughly five miles from Highway 82 and seven miles from Aspen/Pitkin County Airport (ASE). Complimentary shuttle service to/from the Aspen Airport is available.

**Vail/Eagle County Airport (EGE)** is located 70 miles from Snowmass/Aspen. **Grand Junction Walker Field (GJT)** is 125 miles away.

**Denver International Airport (DIA):** Guests traveling to Denver International Airport (DEN) can enjoy a scenic 3.5-hour drive through multiple mountain passes on Highway I-70 in a rental car or via airport shuttle.

### **Driving Directions**

- From Aspen/Pitkin County Airport (ASE)
- Turn left onto CO-82 West.
- After approximately 2 miles, turn left on Brush Creek Road.
- Remain on Brush Creek Road for approximately 2.5 miles until reaching the roundabout.
- Follow the signs to Snowmass Village Mall and continue on Brush Creek Road for approximately 2.8 miles.
- Turn right onto Carriage Way/Snowmelt Road.
- Take the next left onto Elbert Lane.
- The resort is ahead at the end of the road.

- Follow the signs to Snowmass Village Mall and continue on Brush Creek Road for approximately 2.8 miles.
- Turn right onto Carriage Way/Snowmelt Road.
- Take the next left onto Elbert Lane.
- The resort is ahead at the end of the road.
